

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL REFLECTION......

THE WAIT IS ALMOST OVER



It's an image that is very meaningful as we await Christmas. In fact, there aren't too many similar images of Mary, carrying Jesus inside her body. We have come to honour her under many titles down the ages, but the earliest one was 'Theotokos', a Greek word which means God-bearer. Mary is the preeminent God-bearer, bearing for us in time the One who was begotten in eternity.

God could only become human in Jesus because Mary freely said 'Yes' at the time of the Annunciation. This was to lead her down a path that was far from easy. We can imagine how much Mary needed the empathy, encouragement and inspiration. The Visitation enabled her to be with a relative who understood what was happening to her, and who was part way through her own pregnancy.

Mary's relief would have been deepened in that shared moment when the Holy Spirit came upon them, and the babe in Elizabeth's womb leapt for joy. As Elizabeth blessed her, Mary found in this meeting support and strength to deal with the difficulties that came with the role of being a God-bearer.

And so on the eve of Christmas, we see in Mary what we too are invited to become: God-bearers in our own day. We can learn so much from this woman who was totally faithful, prayerful and open to the leadings of God. As for her, our lives, in their own way, take us on just as long and arduous journey. We go through patches of trouble and difficulty when it's hard to keep trusting, and persevering. Then, at other times God provides us with moments of support and strengthening.

To be a God-bearer is a challenge. We are called to bear Jesus in such a way that others find him in our daily lives, and especially in the way we love people. As Teresa of Avila said: 'Christ has no body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours'. Each of us bears some part of the image of God inside of us.

God wants to send us forth like Mary to tell the good news of the gospel. As it's almost Christmas, perhaps now is the time to think of ourselves as an inn keeper, as the person who decides whether to allow Jesus in, so that he might be enabled to come to birth anew in us.

Thank you to all the families that have signed up for Flocknote. We inivite all of you and visitors to sign-up to Flocknote, our communication and engagement tool. Our Parish (and the Archdiocese of Brisbane) has officially adopted Flocknote for all parishes, as a safe, new, and improved way of communicating in parishes. Flocknote is free for parishioners to use, and there is no need to download anything. Your info is kept secure and private. It only takes a couple minutes to sign up to receive emails from the parish. You are even able to reply directly back to those emails so we can get feedback and hear from you.

Flocknote is an amazing engagement and communication tool that gives parishes the ability to easily gather all of their parishioner contact info, sacrament history, and planned giving history. Flocknote also helps parishes communicate with their flock through beautiful email newsletters, emails to ministry groups, and is also the place parishes will use to manage their volunteer records. This will give all our parishes a consistent communication hub and interface for all ministry and parish activity, while simplifying communication across the entire archdiocese.

As part of our transition period, we would like to invite our parishioners to register on our new database.

If you have any questions, please speak with the Parish office.

There is also a template of the registration form that can be printed for those who don't have access to a phone or computer. If you need a paper form you will need to return it to the parish office and these forms will be added to Flocknote.


This Christmas, let's appreciate the love we share with those around us and remember the ones we miss.

SAFEGUARDING CORNER

Hi everyone,

We are thrilled to announce the upcoming launch of our ArcheLearn system to our parish. Previously used exclusively by employees, the ArcheLearn system has been expanded to provide our parish volunteers with an enhanced user experience and a streamlined way to access the training they need for their roles. This upgrade ensures that all volunteers have an easy-to-use path to access mandatory training and other learning resources. Below is a sample of the registration page you will encounter when you log on. All your requirements will be on this portal once you have registered and you will be notified when you are required to update your training requirements. PLEASE NOTE: This is for any NEW VOLUNTEERS and is much simpler that what we previously had access to. All volunteers who have a role on the Volunteer Matrix e.g. Counter, Sacristan etc who have previously registered please take note of the following:

For volunteers whose records are up to date and who is part of the Volunteer Safeguarding Matrix, they will be setup in ArcheLearn within the next 14 days. Volunteers will receive an email invitation to their registered email account when their ArcheLearn is created.

Be assured volunteers that the emails are not spam, and if you don't receive an email notification within in the next 14 days please also check your spam/junk folders.

Previous Safeguarding Training: Any previous Safeguarding Training completed in the last two years will be credited in the system, so it only needs to be completed when it is next due to expire.

User-Friendly Interface: Volunteers will enjoy a visually appealing and easy-to-navigate experience, making it simple to discover and access mandatory and relevant learning content, courses, and resources.
